### Why CitySail

In Australia, women are under-represented in organised sport—as participants, coaches, officials, administrators, and board members—when compared to their male cohort. A variety of strategies exist to help equalise opportunities for girls and women, however, concerns continue on how gender bias may prevent them from receiving the full benefits sport and physical activity (PA) can offer.¹

Sailing currently has 30% female participants and in line with the Australian Sailing goals we want to achieve a 50% female participation rate by 2032.

We feel positive that the growth in CitySail entries this year reflects the growth in female participation in sailing.

To get there, we will continue to work hard and not only promote the sport to women but adapt our approach to better suite how women and girls prefer to be involved in sport

Albert Park Yacht Club on Albert Park Lake enjoy arguably the safest places to learn and improve your sailing. While we had some challenging periods of wind this weekend, we most likely would have had to cancel if we had been anywhere on the bay or open water. It's this semi protected area that lets us keep sailing all year round, so don't be a stranger, make the most of our lake, particularly through the cooler months.

### **CitySail 2016-2022**

CitySail grew out of an idea to promote sailing for women and girls with a coaching and racing Regatta at APYC. The first Regatta was held in September 2016 with only a 6 week promotion period. We were delighted and amazed to receive 25 entries in that first year. This confirmed for us that the idea was sound and held merit in the sailing community.

From there we have seen CitySail grow year on year with participants coming from all around the Bay, East Gippland as well as Warrnambool, Portland in the far West and a regular now from Canberra. 2020 and 2021 were Covid Lockdown years which was a huge hit to our endevour of having a yearly event that would grown each time.

Alas, we came back in 2022 with a vengeance, broadly promoted and supported by Australian Sailing resulted in 52 entries and 67 sailors. An absolutely fantastic weekend with great coaches, good sailing, lots of socialising and loads of fun. There was strong support from the regional south west - Portland, Port Fairy, Colac, and Derrinallum Yacht Clubs. We applaud such dedication by those women to developing their sailing abilities.


Be social. It's meant to be fun.








## CREDIT WHERE CREDIT'S DUE


