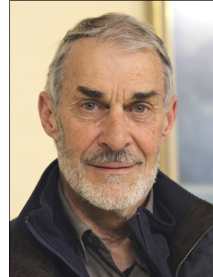

Please remember that if the main carpark is full, there is a space between the Point Restaurant and the Sea Scouts where members of the yacht club can park. The key to let down the chain to this area is located just inside the door to the club. Alternatively there is a gap in the chain right next to the Point where you can just drive in. The club is currently trying to persuade Parks Vic. to place a person at the entrance to Aquatic Drive when there are major events on at the Stadium, in order to restrict access to our carpark to sailors and Point customers, as used to happen when there was a football match played there on a Saturday. The positive side to the Stadium operating on Saturdays is that our club is getting a lot more exposure, and we could see interest in sailing and membership grow as a result.

The Labour Day weekend is not far away, and with it most classes State Championships. Port Melbourne had actually scheduled a major Laser regatta at their club on the Top of the Bay weekend, and numbers were well down compared with only a couple of years ago. Numbers sailing from our club have remained steady - I think this is because a trip to the bay is a bit more of an adventure for us. 
