

From the wonderful food and goodies to Santa being attacked by pirates, the evening was a credit to those who organised it all. Thank you all on behalf of the club.

You may have noticed in the last few months since the opening of the upgraded 'Lakeside Stadium' (Sth. Melbourne Football Oval) opposite our club, that there has been a lot of activity at the venue on Saturdays, which is making it extremely hard to find a parking spot on some days. Please remember that if the main carpark is full, there is a space between the Point Restaurant and the Sea Scouts where members of the yacht club can park. The key to let down the chain to this area is located just inside the door to the club. Alternatively there is a gap in the chain right next to the Point where you can just drive in. The club is currently trying to persuade Parks Vic. to place a person at the entrance to Aquatic Drive when there are major events on at the Stadium, in order to restrict access to our carpark to sailors and Point customers, as used to happen when there was a football match played there on a Saturday. The positive side to the Stadium operating on Saturdays is that our club is getting a lot more exposure, and we could see interest in sailing and membership grow as a result.

The Labour Day weekend is not far away, and with it most classes State Championships. The Impulses are at Cairn Curran, in the Western district (could suit our lake sailing members), and the Pacers are at Black Rock, along with the fledgling Persuit class (in which members of our club had great success at the recent Nationals). The Sabre class held its States last weekend at Sandringham, and was represented by 4 of our members, which is a record in recent times. More on all past and also future class events will appear elsewhere in this newsletter.

The interclub regatta Top of the Bay was held a couple of weeks ago at Elwood Sailing Club. Instead of the usual 20 knot gale, this year the wind was very light indeed. Unfortunately there was no shortened course to be seen for most divisions, so most of us ran out of time, and ended up paddling in or being towed. A nonevent was declared for the 3rd time in 4 years since so few boats finished. The future of this regatta is looking a bit dim, with many of the 6 clubs participating not seeming to care about it any more. Port Melbourne had actually scheduled a major Laser regatta at their club on the Top of the Bay weekend, and numbers were well down compared with only a couple of years ago. Numbers sailing from our club have remained steady - I think this is because a trip to the bay is a bit more of an adventure for us. I will chat with some of the other clubs involved and see if we can generate some more enthusiasm for next year.

The weekend after the Labour Day weekend is the Grand Prix, (15th – 18th March). As usual, Albert Park will be closed for the week prior to the race, and a couple of days afterwards. Specifically, from midnight Monday 12th (Labour Day) until midday Tuesday 20th March. This year the Grand Prix Corporation have asked us to run a sailing event during the GP, as we have done in the past.
