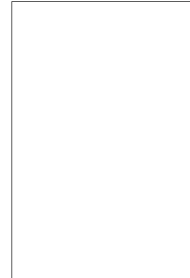

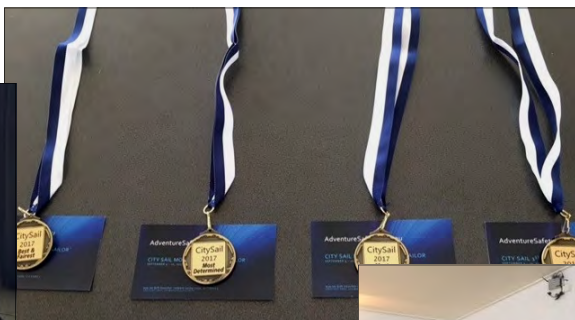

It wasn't too long before Ern with his enthusiasm joined the APYC committee and became the Secretary until 1982 under the late Ross Worden, was Vice Commodore eventually being the Club's Commodore from 1984 to 1986. (It was a privilege to be Ern's Vice Commodore).

During his term of office the Club conducted the annual "Frostbite Regatta" in May when many neighbouring Clubs joined for this two day event. Another event was the bi-annual 24 hour Sail-a-thon when sailors looked for sponsors to raise funds for a particular Local Charity the Club nominated.

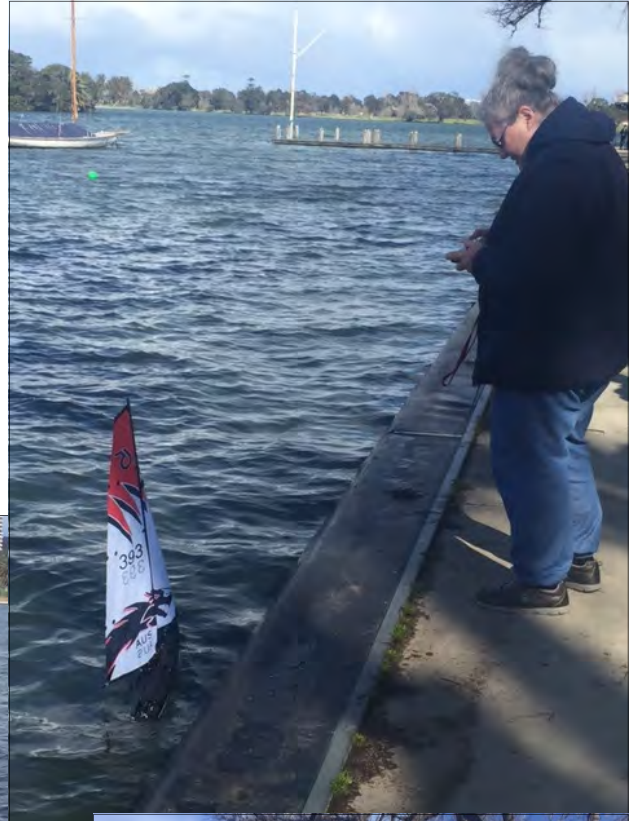


Dragon Force Boat Races by Jennifer Jaeger
